

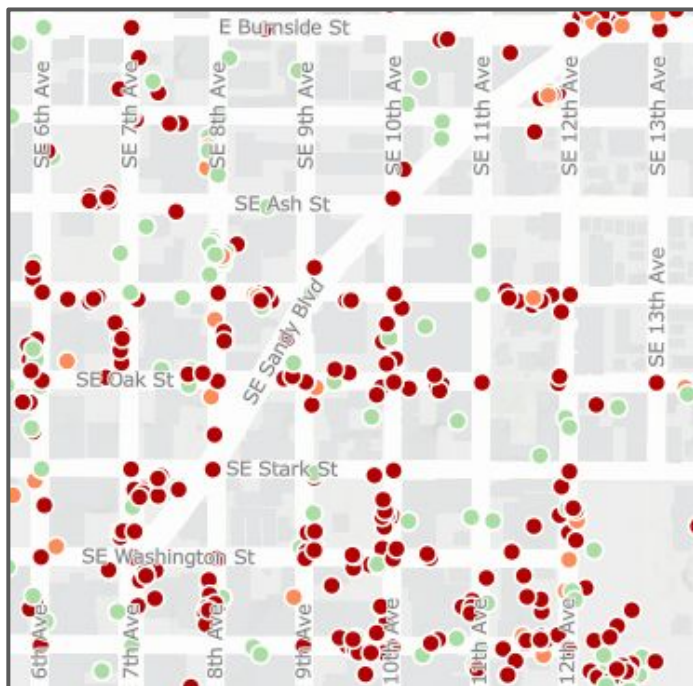

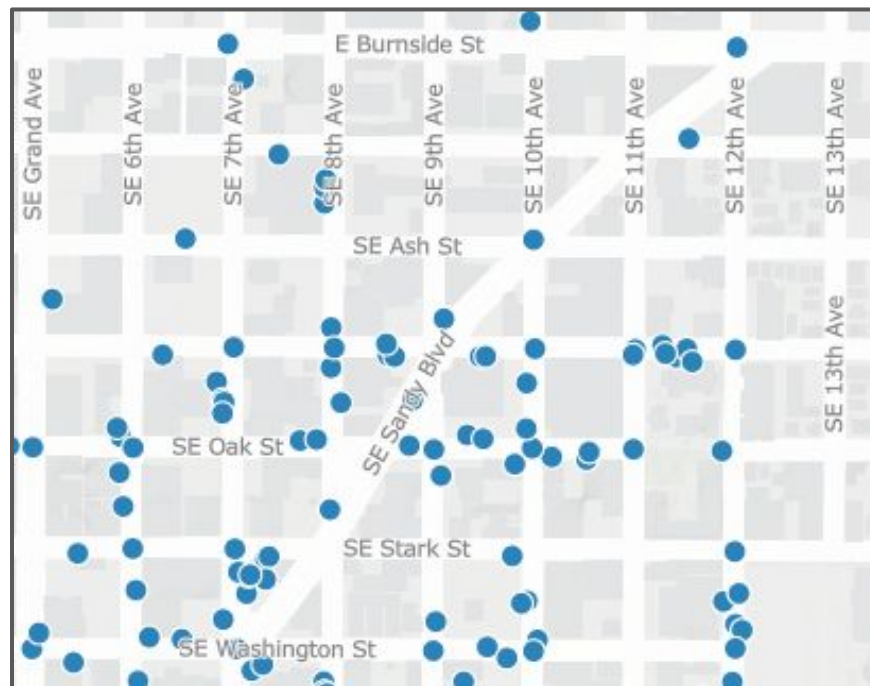

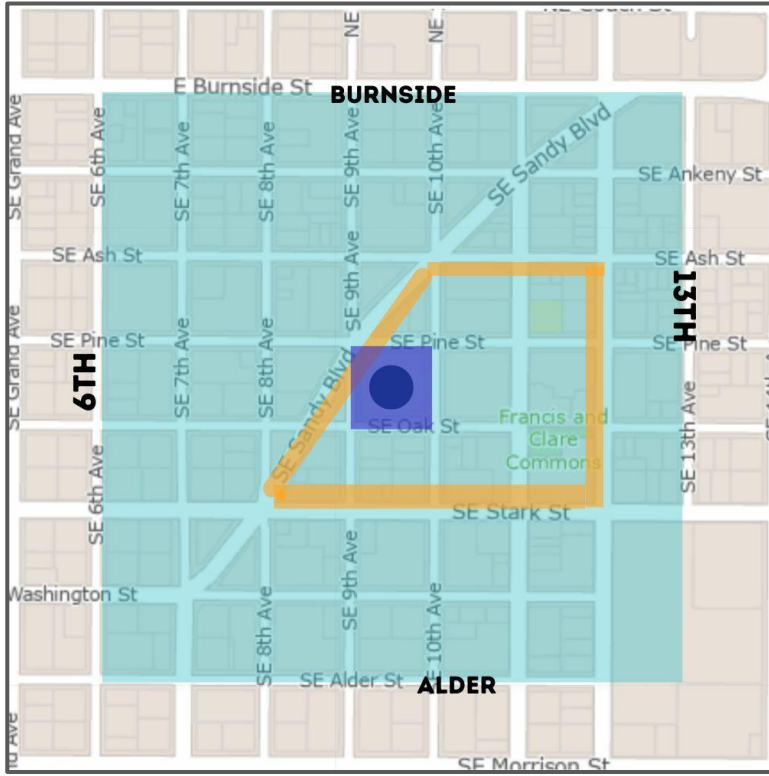

Clean-ups in last year



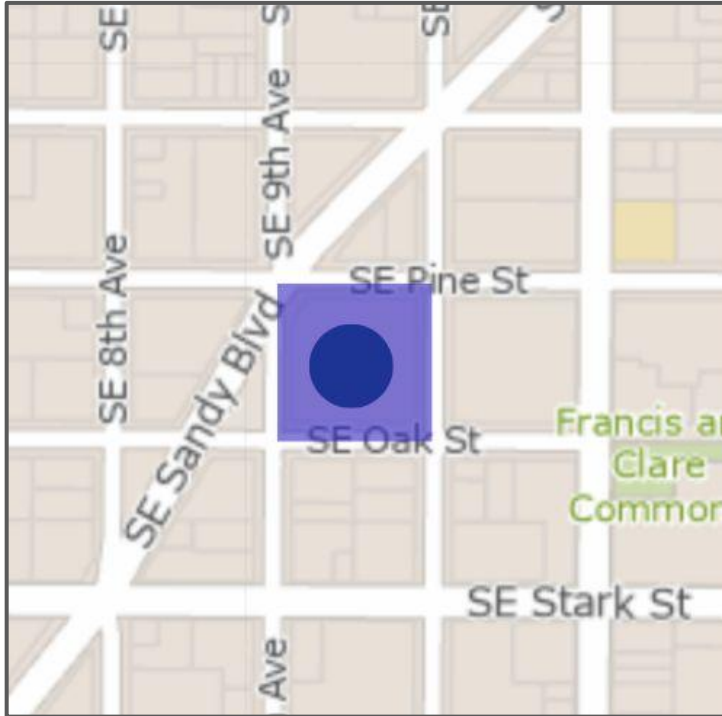
External Impact Zones



- **Zone 1: Facility Perimeter**
- **Zone 2: Enhanced Service Zone**
- **Zone 3: Clean-up and Outreach zone**



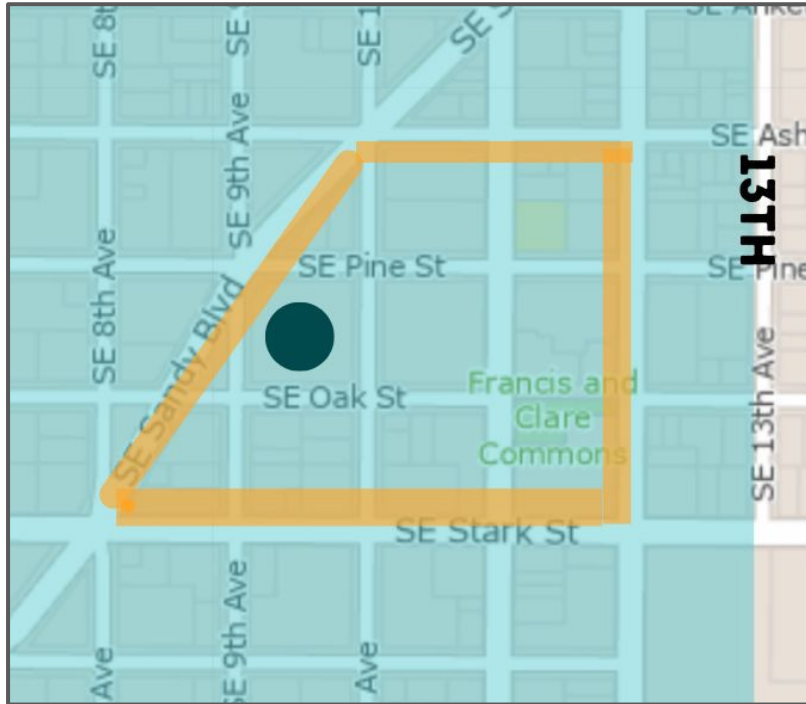
Zone 1: Perimeter of the Pathway Center



- Hourly patrols by Tuerk House staff and County security
- Groundskeeping and power washing (weekly and as-needed)
- Sharps and other biohazards removal as needed
- Power washing of graffiti, biohazards within 24-hours of reporting



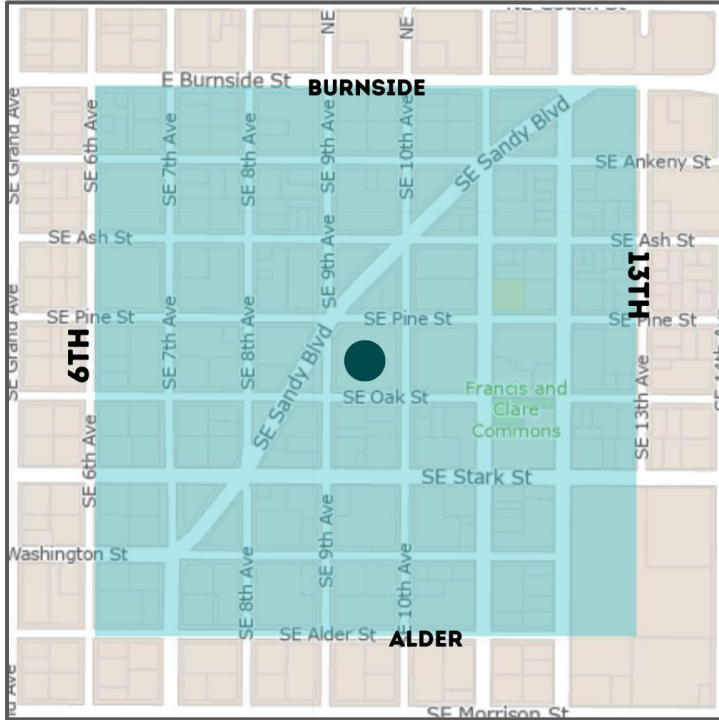
Zone 2: Enhanced Service Zone



- **Vehicle patrols:**
 - 2 vehicles, 2 people per 12-hour shift
 - Neighborhood eyes and ears
 - Additional patrols able to be dispatched if needed
- **Focus:**
 - Monitoring and reporting of drug dealing
 - Reporting illegal behavior
 - High-impact campsite reporting
- **Able to intervene within scope of Oregon Good Samaritan Law**



Zone 3: Clean-Up and Outreach zone



- **Confirmed:**
 - **Peer Outreach teams from Multnomah County**
 - **Regular reassessment of needs and continuous improvement**
 - **High-priority zone for encampment assessment and cleanup**
- **In Process:**
 - **Neighborhood needs assessment to establish baseline**
 - **Seek to expand trash/debris cleanup in partnership with CEIC**



High Impact Encampments

- **High priority zone to address unsanctioned campsites.**
- **City will engage within 3 days to to visit and assess the campsite.**
- **Highest impact camps will be posted for removal. Individuals given 72 hours notice.**
- **Attempts will be made to connect individuals to the City's Street Service Coordination Center (SSCC) resources.**



Safety & Reporting

- Tuerk House and on-site County Security have a direct line to the County Security Operations Center (SOC), which is in direct communication with PPB
- Security Operations Center can report encampments directly to [PDX Reporter](#)
- Suspected drug dealing can be reported [here](#)
- County security will be on heightened alert for potential drug dealing and has process in place for monitoring and reporting to PPB
- Emergency situations should still be reported to 911



Transportation

- **Pilot immediate access to on-site transportation**
- **Mobile crisis teams**
- **Free transportation to an individual's next destination or home**
- **Non-emergency transportation for medical reasons**
- **Emergency medical transportation**
- **Provider-based transportation**
